UNDERPRIVILEGED children from Pertubuhan Amal & Kebajikan Anak2 Islam Tersisih Selangor (Pakats) were recently able. to plant vegetation and fruits around their shelter compound with the help of 7-Eleven Malaysia and NGOHub Asia.
